Below are the key learning links for each subject that will be covered in Year 2 this half term.

Stories with Familiar Setting

Place Value

- Read and write numbers to at least 100 in

28 means 2 tens and 8 units (ones)


numerals and in words.

- Recognise the place value of each digit in a two digit number (tens, ones)
- Identify, represent and estimate numbers using different representations including the number line.
- Compare and order numbers from 0 up to 100; use and = signs.
- Use place value and number facts to solve problems.

Count in steps of 2, 3 and 5 from 0, and in tens from any number, forward and backward.

Addition and Subtraction

- Recall and use addition and subtraction facts to 20 fluently, and derive and use related facts up to 100. - Add and subtract numbers using concrete objects, pictorial representations, and mentally, including: a two-digit number and ones; a two-digit number and tens; two two-digit numbers; adding three one-digit numbers



Physical Education

Gvmnastics

This topic gives children the opportunity to perform different jumps with control and accuracy as well as attempting to demonstrate a variety of shapes whilst taking flight through the air.

Invasion Games

This topic gives children the opportunity to increase their knowledge of the terms 'accuracy' and 'speed' through passing (throwing and kicking) different objects within a small group setting.
