

Year 2 Curriculum Newsletter: Spring 1

Below are the key learning links for each subject that will be covered in Year 2 this half term.



Enalish

Man on the Moon

Stories by the Same Author

- Use apostrophes for contracted forms e.g. don't, can't, wouldn't, you're, I'll.
- Use subordination for time using when, before and after e.g. We went out to play when we had finished our writing. When we had finished our writing, we went out to play.
- Use past tense for

narratives, recounts and historical reports.

- Orally rehearse each sentence prior to writing.
- Develop stamina for writing in order to write at length.
- Read aloud their writing with intonation to make their meaning clear.

Non-Chronological Reports

- Use subordination for reason using because and if e.g. I put on my coat because it was raining. Because it was raining, I put on my coat.
- Use present tense for non-chronological reports.
- Use past tense for historical reports.
- Plan and discuss what to write about e.g. text mapping, collecting new vocabulary, key words and ideas.
- Use specific text type features to write for a range of audiences and purposes e.g. to inform.
- Write about real events.
- Edit and improve their own writing in relation to audience and purpose.

Maths

MONEY

- Count money in pence and pounds with notes and coins.
- Choose the correct notes and coins to make an amount.
- Compare and calculate with money
- Find the change



MULTIPLICATION AND DIVISION

- Recognise, make and add equal groups.
- Use the multiplication symbol and create multiplication sentences
- Use arrays to solve problems.
- Multiply and divide by 2, 5 and 10.
